## **What It Means to Be a Member of Council**

Serving on Council is an important public responsibility. Council members are elected to represent the community as a whole and to make decisions in the best interest of the municipality.

### **What Council Does**

- Sets Policy and Direction – Passes bylaws and policies, establishes long-term goals, and approves municipal plans.
- Approves the Budget – Sets the annual operating and capital budgets and the municipal tax rate.
- Makes Decisions as a Group – Decisions are made by resolution at public Council meetings.
- Provides Governance Oversight – Hires and evaluates the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) and ensures policies are followed.
- Represents the Community – acts in the best interest of the municipality as a whole.

### **What Council Does NOT Do**

- Does Not Manage Staff – Councillors do not direct municipal employees. All staff report to the CAO.
- Does Not Make Decisions Individually – Authority rests with Council as a whole.
- Does Not Handle Day-to-Day Operations – Operational matters are handled by Administration.
- Cannot Override Provincial or Federal Law – Municipalities operate within provincial legislation.
- Cannot Promise Individual Outcomes – Decisions must follow policy, legislation, and budget constraints.

**Fact vs Fiction**

Fiction: "A councillor can fix my issue directly."

Fact: Councillors bring issues forward, but decisions are made collectively.

Fiction: "Council runs the Town office."

Fact: Council sets direction. Administration manages operations.

Fiction: "If elected, I can make changes immediately."

Fact: Change requires policy review, majority vote, and often budget approval.

Fiction: "Council members are involved in hiring and firing staff."

Fact: Council hires and evaluates the CAO only. The CAO manages staff.

**Time Commitment & expectations**

Council members are expected to attend regular Council meetings, review meeting materials in advance, participate in committee meetings (if appointed), and attend community events as representatives.

**Responsibilities Under Legislation**

Council members must act in the best interest of the entire municipality, avoid conflicts of interest, maintain confidentiality when required, and follow The Municipalities Act and other applicable legislation.
